Code Green Webinar Huge Success

The Code Green webinar, presented by Architectural Record & GreenSource and sponsored by ICC Evaluation Service (ICC-ES), drew more than a thousand attendees. The hour-long webinar, held on March 28, covered the following topics: the differences between building codes, standards and rating systems; the need for both green building rating systems and green building codes; recent efforts to develop green building codes; and the challenges inherent in developing and implementing green codes.

There were several expert presenters involved, including Rob Brooks, Director, ICC-ES Environmental Programs; Joann Gonchar, Senior Editor, *Architectural Record*; Marsha Maytum, AIA, LEED AP, Founding Partner, Leddy Maytum Stacy Architects; Brendan Owens, LEED AP, P.E., Vice President, LEED Technical Development, U.S. Green Building Council; and Russell Unger, Executive Director, Urban Green Council, U.S. Green Building Council New York Chapter.
